## RESEARCH / INTELLECTUAL / TEACHING INTERESTS

I work in the traditions of critical health, social, and policy studies. My research, strongly grounded on my medical training and clinical experience, examines the social production of health and disease in the context of the globalization of corporate capitalism, the geopolitics of health, and medicalization and social control in medicine and public health. Over the years I have used diabetes, obesity, Alzheimer disease, and more recently, Covid-19, as case studies to examine how this social production operates. Additional intellectual interests include the philosophy and history of science, the critical analysis of discourse, propaganda studies, and the scholarship of teaching and learning. I teach or have taught courses in the sociology of health, illness, and medicine, in comparative health policy, in the politics of global health, in the sociology of power, and in sociological theory. My research and my teaching have become closely intertwined, as I seek better ways to communicate ideas and convey to my students the power of the sociological lens that has so deeply transformed my own intellectual, professional, civic, and personal lives.
