RESEARCH / INTELLECTUAL / TEACHING INTERESTS

I work in the traditions of critical health, social, and policy studies. My research in the social production and developmental origins of health and disease is informed by several fields and intellectual traditions - the politics of public policy, the globalization of corporate capitalism, the geopolitics of health, and the sociology of medicalization and social control. It is also strongly grounded in my medical training and former clinical practice. Over the years I have used diabetes, obesity, Alzheimer disease, and currently, Covid-19, as case studies to examine these processes. Other intellectual interests include the philosophy and history of science, the critical analysis of discourse, propaganda studies, and the scholarship of teaching and learning. I have published widely in my areas of expertise in refereed and popular venues, I have presented at international, national, and regional conferences, and I have served as Editorial Board Member and reviewer of various refereed journals. I teach / have taught courses in public policy and health, in comparative health policy, in the politics of health policy, in the sociology of health and medicine, in the sociology of power, and in sociological theory. My research and my teaching have co-evolved, as I seek better ways to train my students in the sociological lens and in the tools of critical inquiry that have so deeply transformed my own intellectual, professional, civic, and personal lives.
