Bio

My research examines the drivers of social and health inequalities at local, national, and global levels. My frame of reference to investigate these inequalities and their reproduction includes the geopolitics of public policy, the history of capitalist globalization, and the use of medical frames – i.e., medicalization – to reproduce social hierarchies. Due to my past clinical experience, I have often used diabetes and obesity as case studies to shed light on these processes.

While I am not an “area studies” scholar, I have conducted research on several regions in the “global South” (e.g., Palestine and selected Latin American countries). Drawing from Marxist, critical development and anticolonial lenses, I have examined and continue to examine how the power dynamics underlying major global institutions - economic (IMF, World Bank), military (NATO) and political/policy (UN/WHO) - shape health and other inequalities in those regions. Additional intellectual interests include the sociology, philosophy, and history of science, the critical analysis of discourse, and the scholarship of teaching and learning.

I teach or have taught courses in the sociology of health, in comparative health policy, in the politics of global health, in the sociology of power, and in sociological theory. My research and my teaching have always been tightly intertwined. I have developed very close bonds with many students and my teaching continuously challenges me to clarify my ideas, seek better ways to communicate them, and sharpen my ability to articulate the power of the sociological lens that has so deeply transformed my intellectual, professional, civic, and personal lives.
