Activity: Three research-based community outreach activities were developed by Fox and trainees and held at York's 'Science Rendezvous' annual science fair. More than 1000 youth and their parents were engaged in an interactive learning booth that invited them to reflect on their knowledge and assumptions about aging, and consider how media such as cartoons, magazines, and birthday cards portray aging. The learning booth included empathy-building simulations that allowed young people and their families to experience some of the physiological and sensory changes associated with aging.

2014 – 2018

Lead, Community Engagement with research trainees

Activity: Based on findings of a funded project, Fox and trainees developed and held two York-TD Community Engagement Centre Outreach – Ageism workshops. The workshops incorporated empathy-building simulations and introduced youth to the physiological and social aspects of aging, with a particular emphasis on raising critical awareness around the negative effects of ageism in society. Over 100 youth attended and were provided the opportunity to challenge myths and stereotypes about older people, discover cross-cultural perspectives on aging, and learn about ageism's costs to society.

2011 – 2012

Lead, Community Engagement

Activity: This Knowledge Exchange activity brought together researchers and knowledge users responsible for policy, program and practice development in acute and community healthcare services for older adults. Fox and trainees held a series of meetings with national decision-makers (policy makers and advisors, administrators, directors) and clinicians (nurses and physiotherapists) and international researchers to identify research priorities. Several priorities were identified in response to knowledge users' information needs. A document synthesizing stakeholders' knowledge needs and a map outlining future related research initiatives were developed. Research and decision maker partnerships were established. Teams were formed to begin work on the research priorities. The document evolving from the activities forms the basis for my program of research.

TEACHING

UNDERGRADUATE COURSES TAUGHT

NURS3300 and NURS3515 are 3.0 credit non-elective courses that explore the research basis of nursing practice. Research methods, including qualitative and quantitative approaches are examined along with methods of analysis. Students develop the ability to critique and use research in practice.

Lead teacher Winter 2008 for 3 sections & Fall 2009 for 10 sections. Responsibilities included developing the course syllabus and exams, providing all class lectures and power points, and mentoring new teachers in administrative, curriculum, or student issues.

NURS3600 is a 3.0 credit elective course that provides students with the opportunity to develop knowledge, skills and experiences regarding the processes of aging and chronic illness management. Students explore theoretical models of aging and health. They develop an understanding of the influences of the social determinants of health and illness factors influencing the aging process.

UNDERGRADUATE COURSES CO-DEVELOPED

HH/NURS3000 Trends and Contemporary issues for the Aging Adult in Canada.

This course examines current major issues in gerontology using a life span perspective focusing on the needs and concerns along the continuum of persons' lives in various environments. Students will explore and discuss current trends and issues relating to the aging adult in Canada, their own perceptions of aging, and how their personal experiences and societal attitudes have influenced these perceptions.

GRADUATE COURSES TAUGHT

HH/NURS 5880 3.0 Practice-Based Research Proposal

Practice-Based Research Proposal is a non-credit non-elective course for Nurse Practitioner Master students. The course provides students with an opportunity to integrate learning throughout the program. Students undertake a critical and analytic reflection on a topic/issue/problem related to their practicum experience in NURS 5870 6.0 Integrative Practicum. The final Practice-Based Research Proposal represents the synthesis of learning from core MScN courses and core Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner courses through the development of a research proposal. Students are supervised in the preparation of a research proposal which includes a critical review of the literature, development of a theoretical perspective, and a section on proposed design and methodology.

HH/NURS 6300 Expressions of Nursing Scholarship Colloquium

This is a required non-credit online course in which graduate students have the opportunity to discuss their progress in their Major Research Project or Thesis.

HH/NURS 7030. Systematic Reviews of Healthcare Interventions.

Synthesized evidence is increasingly recognized as the basis for clinical, administrative, and policy in nursing and other disciplines. A systematic review is a method used to identify, select, synthesize, and appraise primary research studies in order to answer specific research questions. In this course, students will develop the ability to understand and critique systematic reviews of evidence derived from intervention research, and perform a future review.

HH/NURS 7035. Models of Care in Addressing the Needs of an Aging Population with Complex Health Care Needs.

Older adults' hospital admissions are associated with poor health, functional and discharge outcomes. This course explores models of care that have been designed to improve health, functional and discharge outcomes for older adults with complex health care needs.
